



Code of Conduct for Faith Formation Classes 2020-21

Mary Queen of Peace Faith Formation program's code of conduct gives the expectations of the teachers, staff, and students regarding student conduct within faith formation classes.

Student Responsibilities

Student Responsibilities for achieving a positive learning environment during Faith Formation classes will include:

- No cell phones, I-pods, game boys or other electronic equipment will be allowed in the classroom.
- No food or beverages in the classrooms.
- Attend **All** scheduled faith formation classes (except when ill or otherwise excused)
- Follow rules, and directives concerning appropriate behavior and safety.
- Show respect for others, teachers and other students.
- Refrain from using profane language, name calling and threatening remarks.
- Strive toward self-discipline.
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Parent/Legal Guardian responsibilities

- Live the faith yourself and model the faith for your children. Attend Mass weekly and use the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Establish and maintain a positive relationship between your student and their teacher.
- Attend your student's faith formation classes as a volunteer observer. Have a background check if needed.
- Encourage your student to follow the rules and Code of Conduct.
- Cooperate with faith formation staff and teachers when their child is involved in a disciplinary occasion.
- Cell phones, I-pods etc. are not allowed in the classrooms please comply with this request. If you need to contact your student other arrangements will be made.

Teacher Responsibilities

- Live the faith yourself and model the faith for your students. Attend Mass weekly and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Teach the curriculum that has been chosen for Mary Queen of Peace students.
- Maintain an orderly classroom, give respect to your students and expect respect in return. List behavior expectations in the beginning of the faith formation year.
- Follow the discipline policy outlined in the handbook. You do not need to put up with students that are disrespectful or disruptive.
- Follow the Code of Conduct for discipline policies.

CONSEQUENCES FOR CONDUCT VIOLATIONS:

Failure to observe the rules concerning electronic equipment in the classroom will result in the cell phone, I-pod etc. being confiscated and picked up by the parents at the end of class.

Disruptive, destructive, or disrespectful behavior will result in one verbal warning.

Second violation will result in the student being sent to the office and require a meeting with the student, parents, and Director of Faith Formation before returning to the classroom. Possible consequences include: returning to class with strict guidelines, parents needing to attend class with student to monitor behaviors, or students needing to finish the year at home with parents.
